



# PLANES, TRAINS AND AUTOMOBILES

## DAY 1

This trip to Bowling Green will get you revved up and ready for fun! Jump start your day with a tour of the **General Motors Bowling Green Assembly Plant** – the only place in the world America’s Sports Car is manufactured. The 1-hour, 1-mile walking tour will take you through the process of producing a Corvette. *Remember – no cell phones, cameras, purses, back packs, open-toe shoes and check their website for tours.*

Journey just across the street to the **National Corvette Museum**, a 115,000 sq. ft. ‘gateway to all things Corvette.’ The Museum includes many new interactive and hands-on exhibits, a film about Corvette history in the Chevrolet Theater, period exhibits, a huge Corvette Store and more! While your there, be sure and make a pit stop in the **Corvette Café**, a 50s-themed diner, and choose from burgers, shakes and even modern-day favorites like wraps, soups and daily specials.

After lunch, venture to **Aviation Heritage Park** and see a restored Phantom II #550 which became famous after Brigadier General Dan Cherry shot down a MiG-21 during the Vietnam War while flying the bird. A Grumman F9F-5 Panther will soon join the Phantom.

Take a break for some needed R&R at the hotel before heading out to **Beech Bend Raceway** for fun racing! Each Tuesday night from March through October you can catch local suped-up rides drag racing down the strip.

After that fast action, head back downtown to Bowling Green’s oldest brick home for a delicious local meal at **Mariah’s Restaurant**. Choose from steak, seafood, pasta, salad and other favorites.

## DAY 2

After sleeping in, catch some breakfast at the hotel then chug on over to the **Historic Railpark and Train Museum** and learn the history of the rails in the 1925 restored L&N Depot. Don’t miss the collection of railcars out back!

Next, venture through Kentucky countryside to the Chaney farm. Here you’ll ride a different kind of automobile – a tractor-pulled wagon – to the barn for a lesson on cows and how ice cream is made. After the tour, mosey on up to **Chaney’s Dairy Barn** for a tasty lunch of sandwiches, soups and of course, ice cream! Their gift shop of Kentucky-made products is a can’t miss, too! Wrap up the day at **Rock Garden Farm**, minutes up the road with some more Kentucky crafts!
